FIRST READING *II Chronicles 36:14-16, 19-23*

A Reading from the second Book of Chronicles:

In those days, all the princes of Judah, the priests, and the people added infidelity to infidelity, practicing all the abominations of the nations and polluting the LORD's temple which he had consecrated in Jerusalem. Early and often did the LORD, the God of their fathers, send his messengers to them, for he had compassion on his people and his dwelling place. But they mocked the messengers of God, despised his warnings, and scoffed at his prophets, until the anger of the LORD against his people was so inflamed that there was no remedy. Their enemies burnt the house of God, tore down the walls of Jerusalem, set all its palaces afire, and destroyed all its precious objects. Those who escaped the sword were carried captive to Babylon, where they became servants of the king of the Chaldeans and his sons until the kingdom of the Persians came to power. All this was to fulfill the word of the LORD spoken by Jeremiah: "Until the land has retrieved its lost sabbaths, during all the time it lies waste it shall have rest while seventy years are fulfilled." In the first year of Cyrus, king of Persia, in order to fulfill the word of the LORD spoken by Jeremiah, the LORD inspired King Cyrus of Persia to issue this proclamation throughout his kingdom, both by word of mouth and in writing: "Thus says Cyrus, king of Persia: All the kingdoms of the earth the LORD, the God of heaven, has given to me, and he has also charged me to build him a house in Jerusalem, which is in Judah. Whoever, therefore, among you belongs to any part of his people, let him go up, and may his God be with him!"

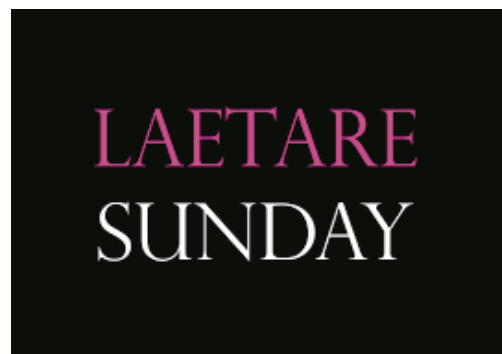

Household of God - by Father Misbrener

Dear Parishioners and Friends:

Painting the People of the Rich Man and Lazarus by St. John Chrysostom:



On purpose I am lingering on this parable, since I see that a great benefit comes from this discussion for both rich and poor and for those who are troubled by the prosperity of the wicked and the poverty and tribulation of the righteous...But this parable is sufficient to provide the remedies, self-control for the rich and consolation for the poor. It teaches the former not to be conceited, with it comforts the poor for their present situation. It persuades the rich not to boast [and] it calls upon the poor not to be disturbed by others' prosperity, nor to think that human affairs are without providence when a righteous person fares badly in this life...

Paint this parable, you rich, you poor, on the walls of your houses; the poor, on the walls of your hearts. If it is ever obliterated by forgetfulness, paint it again with your memory. Or rather, you rich also paint it in your hearts instead of your houses, and carry it about with you continuously. It will be a school for you and the first lesson of all philosophy. If we have this always portrayed in our hearts, neither will the joys of the present life be able to puff us up for its griefs deject us and cast us down....

If we learn the true nature of wealth and poverty, of glory and dishonor, and of all other bright or gloomy conditions, we shall be freed from the disturbance that each of these produce in us. All these things are more deceptive than shadows. A person who is noble and lofty in spirit will not be lifted too high by any of the brilliant and glorious conditions nor cast down by any humble and despised circumstances.

Basilica Painting Update

Dear Parishioners:

As promised, I want to keep you up to date on the progress of moving ahead with the painting and restoration of the interior of the Basilica. We are blessed to have profession-

al religious restoration artists in our area. I currently have met with Henniger's in Cleveland, and Swiatek Studios out of Buffalo, New York. For our third bid, I will also be meeting with Mazzolini Arcraft Studio in Cleveland. All of these companies have websites, and you can look at their work online.

I have also applied for a Grant from the National Fund For Sacred Landmarks. The Grant I applied for was for \$250,000. We would, of course, have to come up with half of that, which we have available in our preservation funds. The deadline to apply for these funds was Thursday, February 29th, and I applied on the deadline day. This is not the only Grant we can apply for, and I am doing research to possibly apply for more.

As a prudent steward, and Rector, I want to make sure funds are available to us for the restoration. I, however, want to keep the momentum going that Father Sheridan began with the restoration of the exterior of the basilica.

As promised, I want to keep everyone informed of my activities in this regard. Please pray to the Infant Jesus of Prague (that I've had a strong devotion to for many years,) that this project will move forward. Right now, each company is or will be in the process of rendering us drawings of the painting and restoration. Another part of the restoration project is that I would like to put a new floor in the sanctuary, and work on the restoration of our pews.

If we can raise some more money, I would also like to have the basilica air-conditioned. This will not only help with humidity issues, but it will protect the painting, and also the organ, which is also a very important investment. The changing weather really affects the interior of the basilica, and we want to do our best to preserve it for the future as an important landmark of our city and community.
